

## ANNEX .IT – SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE .IT ccTLD

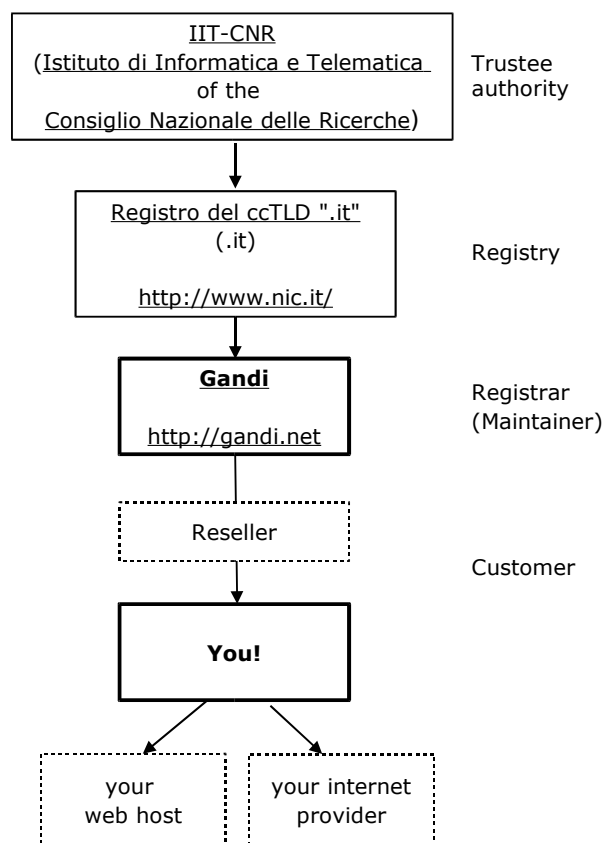

In addition to Gandi's General Terms and Conditions of Domain Name Registration, the registration and use of a .IT domain name implies the acceptance of and compliance to the present special conditions.

### Section .IT.1- Trustee Authority and Registry

The following diagram presents the various parties involved and the Trustee Authority for the .IT ccTLD:



You can view the information and special rules of each party involved by clicking on the respective names.

### Section .IT.2- Registration terms and conditions

.IT domain names are restricted to individuals or organizations within the European Union. When You apply to register a .IT domain name, You acknowledge to have fully understood, and You agree to fully abide by all the rules and specific conditions pertaining to the registration of .IT domain names, as defined by the Registry, and which may be viewed at the following address:

These contracts bind You to the .IT Registry. The present special conditions are not substitutes to these Rules, but are a part of it. You acknowledge to have fully understood and to have accepted these Rules on Our Website.

Please note that, for any request of registration for a new domain name, you must:

- send a "Letter of Assumption of Responsibility" (LAR) to the .IT Registry, in the Italian language, by fax or postal mail (see <http://www.nic.it/en/domini/passi.html> and [http://www.nic.it/en/domini/lettere\\_ar.html](http://www.nic.it/en/domini/lettere_ar.html));
- provide both Gandi and the Registry with your personal

identification number (personal fiscal code, the number of your legal identity document, your company's fiscal code, or VAT number);

- specify nameservers that are correctly configured for the domain name that you intend to register, such that they pass the zone check of the .IT registry.

Please also note that:

- the Registry can request additional documentary proof of the Registrant's declarations. Should it fail to receive such required documentation within established guidelines, or should the technical requirements be insufficient and not corrected within 60 days, the Registry can delete the domain name(s) in question;
- some words are forbidden for registration, or reserved by the Registry (for example Italian regions, provinces, and municipalities);
- most of the operations needed to manage .IT domain names (such as creation, transfer, ownership change, trade, deletion before expiration) require that You send a formal request (signed form sent by fax or postal mail) to the Registry, in the Italian language, within the specified deadline (usually 10 days). Some particular cases also require special documented proof in paper.
- the Registry will not tolerate "cybersquatting", that is to say the systematic buying up and hoarding of domain names;
- you have to pay for the domain name renewal at Gandi before the expiration date of the domain name.

### Section .IT.5- Dispute resolution policy

### Section .IT.6- Transfer

The transfer to Gandi does not include any renewal for a .IT domain name. The creation date is reset by the Registry, and the prorata of the previous registration period is lost.

For any transfer request involving an ownership change for a .IT domain name, the owner of the domain name (registrant) must sign and return the necessary paper form to the Registry.

### Section .IT.7- Restoration

It is possible to restore a deleted .IT domain name up to 30 days after the expiration date, as long as the domain name has the status REDEMPTION-PERIOD. We must receive your restoration payment seven (7) days before the end of the Redemption Period, so that we may carry out the operation within the specified deadline. A .IT restoration will restore your previous settings (specifically the personal data), and will extend the registration period by one (1) year (one year is added to the Expiration date).
