

ANNEX .CH - SPECIAL CONDITIONS FOR THE .CH ccTLD

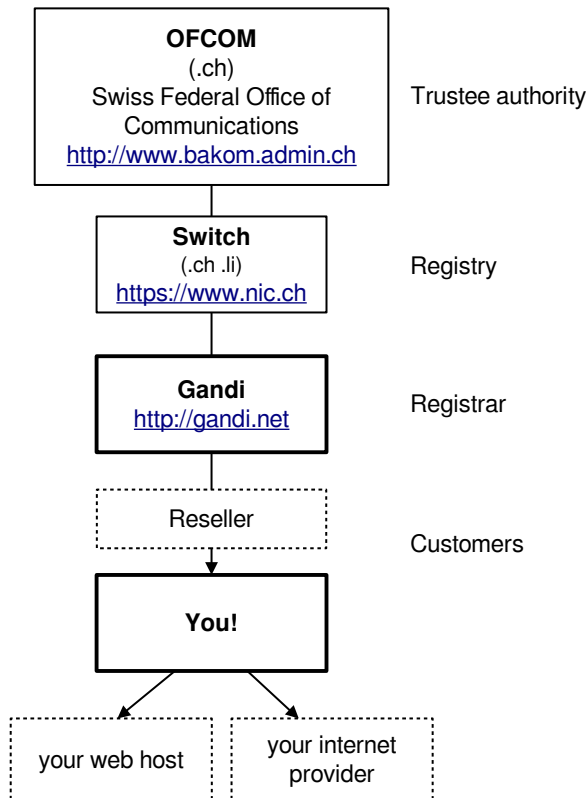

In addition to Gandi's [General Terms and Conditions](#) of domain name registration, the registration and use of a .CH domain name implies the acceptance of and compliance to the present special conditions contained herein.

All Your legal information and contracts can be viewed at any time via Our [website](#). Capitalized terms have the definition attributed to them in our [General Terms and Conditions](#) of Domain Name Registration. Specifically, "You" refers to the owner of the domain name, and "We" designates Gandi.

Section .CH.1. Trustee authority and Registry

.CH is the official country code Top-Level-Domain (ccTLD) of Switzerland. The following diagram presents the various parties involved and the Trustee Authority for the .CH TLD:



You can view the information and special rules of each party involved by clicking on the respective links.

Section .CH.2. Registration terms and conditions

When You apply to register a .CH domain name, You acknowledge that You have fully understood, and that You certify to have full knowledge of and that You agree to abide by all the rules and specific conditions of .CH domain names, as defined by Switch, and which may be viewed at the following page:

These contracts are binding between You and the .CH Registry. The special conditions contained herein do not replace these rules, but rather form part of them. You acknowledge to have fully understood and accepted these rules on Our website.

Section .CH.3. Special requirements

.CH domain names are open to anyone.

Section .CH.4. Registration term

The registration term is 1 year. To avoid any deletion of the domain name, the renewal must be paid, and funds cleared, no later than **2 days before the Expiration date**.

Section .CH.5. Storage of contact information

In application of Our accreditation contract with the .CH Registry, You expressly consent that all personal and technical information associated with the registration of Your domain name is recorded and made available to the Registry, in addition to messages pertaining to each registration or modification, during 10 years from their recording.

You accept that the .CH Registry can access Your personal data and display it in the public [Whois](#) database.

Section .CH.8. Transfer (change of Registrar)

The process is started on Our Interface. Before starting a transfer request, please ensure that:

- You have the domain's authorization code (supplied by Your current Registrar),
- Your domain name does not expire soon (We recommend that You start the transfer request at least 1 month prior to its Expiration),

- Your domain name was transferred at least 60 days prior to the request.

The transfer's completion requires Your confirmation (by e-mail).
The transfer does not change the domain's Expiration date.

Section .CH.9. Ownership change

The ownership change process is available on Our Interface, it requires the confirmation of the two parties by e-mail.

The owner change of a .CH domain name does not change the domain's Expiration date.

Section .CH.10. Deletion process

1 day before the Expiration date, the domain name is placed on Quarantine status and can be restored, in accordance with the terms and conditions described on Our website and/or as communicated by Our customer service department. The length of the Quarantine period is 40 calendar days.

If the domain is neither renewed nor restored within these deadlines, the Registry will delete the domain name, which will become available for registration on a "first come first served" basis.
